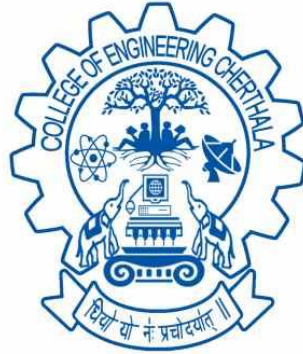

## 2.2 Status of various NCB Packages and BOG approval for the packages.

There are four NCB Packages in the approved Procurement/Minor Civil Works Plan of CE Cherthala. The present status of the NCB packages is summarized as below.

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Nationwide advertisement in National Daily (The Hindu- November 29) and state wide advertisement in Vernacular daily (Malayala Manorama- November 30) was given for all the four NCB packages. The same was also published on the college website. The details of the various NCB Packages are given below.

#### 1. COMPUTERS :TEQIP-II/KL/KLIG19/5

The pre-bid meeting for the package was held on 4.12.2013, following which it was decided that qualification criteria and the technical specifications will be retained as such. Three firms participated in the pre-bid meeting. The bids were opened on 02.01.2014 at 2.00 PM. Two firms, Smartsoft, Cochin- the Manufacturer Authorized Firm (MAF) for Dell and Frontier Business Systems, the MAF for IBM Lenovo submitted bids. Smartsoft Kochi submitted a bid for Rs. 1,02,22,890.30/- inclusive of all taxes. Frontier Business Systems Kochi submitted a bid for Rs. 99,15,486/- inclusive of all taxes. Both bids were found to be technically and commercially responsive by the Procurement Committee. The Procurement Committee recommends that the contract be awarded to the eligible lowest quoting firm Frontier Business Systems, Pvt. Ltd, Kochi, who is the MAF for IBM Lenovo, for an amount of Rs. Rs. 99,15,486/- (Rupees Ninety Nine Lakh Fifteen Thousand Four Hundred and Eighty six only) inclusive of all taxes. This amount is lesser than the budgeted amount of Rs. 1, 00,88,000/- (Rupees One Crore Eighty Eight Thousand only) by Rs. 1,72,514/- (1.7 %). The Bid Evaluation Report for the package Computers: TEQIP-II/KL/KLIG19/5 is shown as Annexure II.

**Action Sought:** It is requested that the BOG may kindly give its approval for the purchase of the package Computers -TEQIP-II/KL/KLIG19/5 from the eligible lowest quoting firm Frontier Business Systems Pvt Ltd, Kochi, the L1 bidder, who is the MAF for IBM Lenovo, for an amount of Rs. 99,15,486/- (Rupees Ninety Nine Lakh Fifteen Thousand Four Hundred and Eighty six only) inclusive of all taxes.

#### 2. UPS: TEQIP-II /KL/KLIG19/6

The pre-bid meeting for the package was held on 4.12.2014, following which it was decided that qualification criteria and the technical specifications will be retained as such. Four firms participated in the pre-bid meeting. The bids were opened on 02.01.2014 at 2.30 PM. Five firms, Supra Hi-Tech Electro Equipments Pvt. Ltd, Cochin, Hykon Thrissur, Novateur Electrical and Digital Systems Pvt. Ltd Cochin, Techser Power Solutions Cochin and Igatech Industrial Electronics Pvt Ltd. Cochin submitted bids. All the firms were Original Equipment Manufacturers (OEM). Supra Hi-Tech Electro Equipments Pvt. Ltd, Cochin, submitted a bid for Rs. 19,05,500/- inclusive of all taxes. Hykon, Thrissur submitted a bid for Rs. 22,40,100/- inclusive of all taxes and did not supply the bid security as required. Igatech, Cochin submitted multiple bids in one price schedule with the lowest being Rs. 18,09,780/- inclusive of all taxes. Techser Power Solutions Kochi submitted a bid for Rs. 19,30,998/- inclusive of all taxes. Novateur Electrical and Digital Systems Pvt. Ltd Cochin submitted a bid for Rs. 17,83,000/- inclusive of all taxes. The Procurement Committee found that the bids from the Igatech Pvt. Ltd, Kochi and Hykon Thrissur were not conforming to the specifications and the format for the bid. All other bids were found to be technically and commercially responsive by the Procurement Committee. The Procurement Committee recommends that the contract be awarded to the eligible lowest quoting firm Novateur Electrical and Digital Systems Pvt. Ltd Cochin for Rs. 17,83,000/- (Rupees Seventeen Lakh Eighty Three Thousand only) inclusive of all taxes. This amount is lesser than the budgeted amount of Rs. 20,00,000/- (Rupees Twenty Two Lakhs only) by Rs. 2,17,000/- (10.85%).

**Action Sought:** It is requested that the BOG may kindly give its approval for the purchase of the package UPS: TEQIP-II /KL/KLIG19/6 from the eligible lowest quoting firm Novateur Electrical and Digital Systems Pvt. Ltd Cochin, the LI bidder, for an amount of Rs. 17,83,000/- (Rupees Seventeen Lakh Eighty Three Thousand only) inclusive of all taxes.

### 3. Network Accessories: TEQIP-II /KL/KLIG19/10

The pre-bid meeting for the package was held on 5.12.2014, following which it was decided that qualification criteria and the technical specifications will be retained as such. Five firms participated in the pre-bid meeting. The bids were opened on 02.01.2014 at 3.00 PM. Three

firms, Zerone Technologies Pvt. Ltd, New Delhi, Techser Power Solutions Pvt. Ltd Cochin and Frontier Business Systems Pvt Ltd. Cochin submitted bids. Zerone Technologies Pvt. Ltd New Delhi, submitted a bid for Rs. 28,13,058.75/- inclusive of all taxes. Techser Power Solutions Pvt. Ltd Cochin submitted a bid for Rs. 34,79,804.25/- inclusive of all taxes. Frontier Business Systems Pvt. Ltd Cochin submitted a bid for Rs. 37,11,414.00/-. The price bid by Frontier Business Systems Pvt. Ltd Cochin included commissioning charges, which were not permissible as per the Bid Invitation Letter. The other bids were found to be technically and commercially responsive by the Procurement Committee. The Procurement Committee recommends that the contract be awarded to the eligible lowest quoting firm Zerone Technologies Pvt. Ltd New Delhi, for Rs. 28,13,058.75/- (Rupees Twenty Eight Lakh Thirteen Thousand Fifty Eight, Paise Seventy Five only) inclusive of all taxes. This amount is lesser than the budgeted amount of Rs. 32, 24,738.00 (Rupees Thirty Two Lakh Twenty Four Thousand Seven Hundred Thirty Eight only) by Rs411679.25/- (12.77%).

**Action Sought:** It is requested that the BOG may kindly give its approval for the purchase of the package Network Accessories -TEQIP-II/KL/KLIG19/5 from the eligible lowest quoting firm Zerone Technologies Pvt. Ltd New Delhi, for Rs. 28,13,058.75/- (Rupees Twenty Eight Lakh Thirteen Thousand Fifty Eight, Paise Seventy Five only) inclusive of all taxes.

#### 4. Servers: TEQIP-II /KL/KLIG19/49

The pre-bid meeting for the package was held on 4.12.2014, following which it was decided that qualification criteria and the technical specifications will be retained as such. Three firms participated in the pre-bid meeting. The bids were scheduled to be opened on 02.01.2014 at 3.30 PM. However it was not done, as only one firm, Frontier Business Systems Pvt. Ltd, MAF for IBM Lenovo, supplied a bid. As per TEQIP-II guidelines, to proceed with a National Competitive Bid, one responsive bid is sufficient. In consultation with the SPFU, as per TEQIP guidelines, the date of opening of the bid was extended by two weeks, to 16.01.2014. The extension of the bid opening date was advertised nationwide through the National Daily “The HINDU” (08.01.2014), state wide (07.01.2014) through the vernacular daily “Mathrubhumi” and through the college website. No other bids were received at the time of opening. The bid submitted by Frontier Business Systems Pvt. Ltd Cochin was for Rs. 20, 90,010/- (Rupees Twenty Lakh Ninety Thousand and Ten only) inclusive of all taxes. The bid submitted by

Frontier Business Systems Pvt. Ltd Cochin was found to be technically and commercially responsive by the Procurement Committee. The Procurement Committee recommends that the contract be awarded to the only eligible firm Frontier Business Systems Pvt. Ltd Cochin for Rs. 20,90,010/- (Rupees Twenty Lakh Ninety Thousand and Ten only) inclusive of all taxes. This amount is lesser than the budgeted amount of Rs. 22,86,000.00 (Rupees Twenty Two Lakh Eighty Six Thousand only) by Rs. 195,990/- (8.6%).

**Action Sought:** It is requested that the BOG may kindly give its approval for the purchase of the package Servers -TEQIP-II/KL/KLIG19/49 from the only eligible firm Frontier Business Systems Pvt. Ltd Cochin for Rs. 20,90,010/- (Rupees Twenty Lakh Ninety Thousand and Ten only) inclusive of all taxes.

Contract for all civil work packages were awarded and the work has been initiated on all packages. The Asst. Executive Engineer of IHRD has certified that more than 25 % of the work on the packages TEQIP-II/KL/KLIG19/85 - Extension of Mechanical W/S, TEQIP-II /KL/KLIG19/89-Extension of building to house Diesel Generator and TEQIP-II /KL/KLIG19/90-Extension of building to provide GD and Interview Rooms have been completed. As per the contract agreement uploaded in the PMSS, 25% of the contract amount for these packages has been disbursed to the contractor after deducting all taxes at the rate of 6.03%, based on the stage completion certificate provided by the Asst. Executive Engineer of IHRD. The Civil works packages are expected to be completed by March 31<sup>st</sup> of 2014.

### Report of the Academic Programmes

- **In-house Programmes**

Expert talks on 'Multirate Filter Banks' was coordinated by Dr. Vinu Thomas, Associate Professor in Electronics on 30/12/2013 (FN) and 31/12/2013 (FN). The talks were delivered by Dr. Rajesh Cherian Roy, Associate Professor, AdiShankara Institute of Engg. & Technology, Kalady.

Thirty faculty of the college attended the programme. The talk was about theory of Perfect Reconstruction, Near Perfect Reconstruction, Quadrature Mirror Filters, Orthogonal and Biorthogonal filter banks. The feedback from the participants was excellent.

An expert talk on ‘Timing Analysis in Digital Systems’ was coordinated by Dr. Jobymol Jacob, Associate Professor in Electronics on 9<sup>th</sup> January 2014. The session was handled by Mr. C.V. AnilKumar, Associate Professor in Electronics, College of Engineering Chengannur. The talk dealt with timing classification, Idealities and non-idealities of clocking in sequential circuits, timing parameters and sources of non-idealities. He also discussed about the latch based design, self timed design, synchronizers and arbiters etc. A total of twenty five faculty members attended the talk. The participants rated the talk as excellent.

Department of Computer Science And Engineering has conducted Training program on “Advanced Algorithm Analysis And Design” on 28<sup>th</sup> ,29<sup>th</sup> ,30<sup>th</sup> ,31<sup>th</sup> of January and 1<sup>st</sup> February 2014 under FSD of TEQIP PHASE II. The program covered all the relevant and advanced algorithms that have various applications in networks, scheduling, social networks and image processing. Faculty had a great opportunity to interact with the resource persons to aid their progress in their research. They were also exposed to many effective approaches for solving relevant problems like cloudlet scheduling in cloud, network traffic management, social network analysis and image compression algorithms. The total span of the program was 5 days. There were 8 resource persons, having abundant expertise in Advanced Algorithm Analysis and Design, for handling different sessions in the program schedule. The revenue generated from this program (fee collected from external participants) was Rs 6000/-. As per the feedback, the entire program was a success and got an “Excellent Rating”.

An expert talk on “An Introduction to Wavelet Transforms” was coordinated by Jasleena C, AP in Electronics on 01/02/2014 (FN)& 03/02/2014 (FN). The talk was delivered by Dr. Gopakumar, Associate Professor in Electronics, College of Engineering Chengannur. Thirty faculty of the college attended the programme. The talk introduced the need for Time Frequency Transforms, STFT, CWT, DWT and its discrete versions, as also algorithms for implementation. Some of the applications of Wavelet Transforms in Image Processing, Computational Electrodynamics etc were introduced. The talk was rated excellent by the participants.

- **Outstation Programmes**

Sri Pradeep M. , HOD, EC Department, Sri Sreekumar K. , AP in EC, Sri IrshadAli T.K, AP in EC, and Sri Devanand C. N., AP in Mechanical Engineering attended the Six Days Training Programme on ‘Statistical Modeling for Data Analysis’ at IIT Kharagpur from 9<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> December 2013. Eminent professors from IIT Kharagpur and other premier institutions handled the classes. Dr.Rudra Pradhan from the Dept. of Management studies of IITK discussed the fundamental aspects of statistics and the modeling strategy. The second day classes were oriented towards regression modeling and hypothesis testing. Prof.Bachi analyzed various aspects of regression analysis. On the third day the discussions were about multi dimensional scaling and cluster analysis. On the remaining days the discussions were on the detailed analysis of Time series modeling and structural equation modeling. The classes were all very informative and scheduled in such a way to facilitate information from scratch to in-depth level.

Radha Balakrishnan, AP in Mathematics, Sandhya P. Gopal, AP in Mechanical Engg., Jaslina C., AP in EC and Sony P., AP in CS attended the TEQIP-II sponsored Two Day Workshop on “Formulating and Evaluating Course Outcomes” at College of Engineering Kidangur on 10<sup>th</sup> & 11<sup>th</sup> February 2014. The course enabled the participants to Construct Learning Objectives/ Learning Outcomes ( LO’s), Prepare a blue print of assessment tools according to the Revised Bloom’s Taxonomy, Design other tools to measure achievement of LO’s. The workshop was well planned and the participants were highly benefited by it.

Suresh T. K., Technician Gr-I, CS Department and George C. Caramel, Technician Gr-I, EC Department attended TEQIP-II sponsored two day ‘Technology Clinic on Laptop and Mobile Phone Maintenance, Repair and Servicing’ organized by Dept. of Electronics and Communication, TKM Engineering College, Kollam on 10<sup>th</sup> & 11<sup>th</sup> of December 2013. Mr. Harilal from InfoTech introduced laptop hardware, types of laptop motherboard, trouble shooting , general problems ,modern tool for servicing ,demonstration of fault location and solution. On second day, Mr. Deepu from INET Kollam discussed about various types of mobile networks, types of mobile phones, general hardware problems, servicing methods, tools, and software alteration. The course was informative and useful.

The training programme on ‘ Research Impact Publishing & Profiling was conducted at SMS Auditorium, CUSAT on 3/1/2014 . Seenamol P.M., Librarian, CE Cherthala attended the programme. The seminar included sessions on ‘Quality and Indexed Research Publications’ ,‘Indexed Databases Impact Measures ,Indicators & profiling’ and ‘Publishing in High Impact journals –Case studies and Illustrations’ .The programme concluded with an interactive session.

According to the participant, the seminar was very useful and gave a clear picture of the quality of research, how to write a good research report, ways to improve science research in India ,citation reports, h index etc.

### **3.2 Faculty Position as on 24.02.2014**

An Associate Professor, Mr. C K Jayadas, and two Assistant Professors, Ms. Remya S and Ms. Anupama A, have joined in the Department of Electronics. The regular faculty strength has now increased to 27 against total faculty strength of 57. The number of regular faculty on campus is 20 at present.

### **3.3 Report on Performance Audit**

The performance audit of the institute was conducted by the Performance Auditor of CE Cherthala, Dr. Suresh Kumar Dhameja, Dean, NITTR, Chandigarh, during 29.1.2014 to 31.01.2014. He was accompanied by the Data Auditor Prof. Pradeep R, College of Engineering Trivandrum. Dr. Dhameja commented favourably on the efforts taken by the TEQIP Cell for the implementation of TEQIP-2 activities under subcomponent 1.1. Dr. Dhameja noted that the institute had made significant progress on most fronts, with the deficiencies in faculty strength and built up space to be addressed by the parent body at the earliest. He also commented that pedagogical programmes need to be conducted at the basic and advanced levels for the faculty and staff which the various NITTRs conduct regularly. He noted with appreciation in the final meeting with the TEQIP cell that despite the college having only 18 regular faculty, it had topped the second cycle institutions of the state, in terms of expenditure upto the month of January 2014. Prior to this, the Data Auditor Prof. Pradeep R had visited the campus on 8<sup>th</sup> January 2014 to conduct the data audit.

### **3.4 Report on visit of Mentor**

The second visit of the mentor Dr. P Pratapachandran Nair, was conducted on February 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> of 2014. He interacted with the TEQIP Cell, faculty, technical and office staff on both days. Some of the Alumni had a discussion with the mentor in person and through Video Conference, during which he advised them on various ways in which they could contribute back to the college.

The meeting started with silent prayer at 10.30 AM.

The Hon'ble Chairman brought the meeting to order. The Chairman in his introductory note commended the efforts put in by the Principal and the TEQIP Cell of CE Cherthala for the implementation of TEQIP-II project at the institute. He expressed satisfaction at the progress in Procurement and the Academic activities. Sri Jacob Mathew, Vice President of Idea Cellular, Mumbai, was introduced by the Principal. The BOG sought his help and suggestions in

improving the academic activities and industry linkage at CE Cherthala. Sri Jacob Mathew assured all possible support.

The Hon'ble Chairman invited the Principal to introduce the agenda for the third BOG meeting. Principal Dr P Suresh Kumar thanked the Hon'ble Chairman and presented the agenda for the meeting.

### **1.1 Confirmation of the Minutes of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Meeting of the Board of Governors held on 29-10-2013 at CE Cherthala**

The Minutes of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Meeting of Board of Governors of TEQIP Phase II of CE Cherthala held on 29-10-13 was approved by the BOG.

#### **2.1 Ratification of expenditure incurred for procurement of goods**

The procurement of the items as mentioned in the detailed agenda notes for the third BOG were approved. The justifications for the revisions were explained by TEQIP Coordinator Dr. Vinu Thomas and Procurement Coordinator Prof. Manilal D L. The justifications were already entered in the Procurement Plan through the Procurement Management Support Software (PMSS).

Hence the BOG unanimously approved the revisions of the Procurement Plan in view of the justifications.

#### **2.2 Consideration of a procurement package for virtual class room for QEEE**

The QEEE (Quality Enhancement in Engineering Education) programme envisaged by the MHRD was explained by the TEQIP Coordinator. He reported that the QEEE live lectures and live tutorials had to be included in the regular time table as per the instructions received. Dr. V P Devassia opined that it will be difficult to incorporate QEEE live lectures, tutorials and labs in the timetable, and they should be considered only as value addition programmes. Prof. K. Narayanan informed the BOG that QEEE is on MHRD's long term agenda. It is being introduced on a test basis to get the feedbacks from the participating institutions and observe the limitations in implementing the programme. The BOG decided in principle, to participate in the QEEE programme, to the extent possible and to purchase the necessary equipment when quotes for the same are made available by the QEEE programme.

### **2.3 Ratification of the various in house FDP programs for the faculty, technical staff and administrative staff conducted**

The Principal presented the report of various in house FDP programmes at the college as per the detailed agenda notes. The BOG approved the programmes conducted. The BOG directed that the revenue generated by such programmes should be included.

### **2.4 Ratification of the various EAP/IIIC programmes for the students and the expenditure incurred.**

The Principal presented the report of various EAP/IIIC programmes at the college as per the detailed agenda notes. The BOG approved the programmes conducted.

### **2.5 Ratification of the various outstation training programs attended by faculty.**

The Principal presented the report of various outstation subject domain and management capacity building programmes attended by the faculty and staff of the college as per the detailed agenda notes. The BOG approved the programmes conducted.

Sri M Sheriff and Sri James Joseph commented that whenever possible, the prior approval for conduct of academic programmes should be obtained from the BOG, and their estimated expenditure should be approved. Prof. Narayanan asked the Academic committee to revise TNA plan every six months and get the BOG approval.

Prof. Narayanan also opined that the faculty and staff maybe encouraged attending online certification programmes that have credibility, and that expenditure towards such programmes maybe met from TEQIP-II funds when the certificates are produced by the faculty/staff concerned.

### **2.6 Ratification of utilizing the services of the Technical Consultants –**

The BOG ratified the decision to utilize the services of Shri Sreekumar N, Asst. Executive Engineer IHRD and Mr. Noushil P M ,Asst. Engineer IHRD for the civil works packages (no.s 85, 86, 87, 89, 90) and Mr. Arun Prasad, Assistant Professor, Model Engineering College,

Thrikkakara, for the Electrification package (no. 88 ) under Procurement Plan of C E Cherthala, as the sanction from IHRD has already been obtained.

## **2.7 Remedial Classes and Bridge Course conducted and Ratification of expenditure incurred**

The BOG approved the list of remedial classes conducted and the bridge courses conducted for the first year students at the college, presented by the Principal.

On a pertinent note, Professor Narayanan commented on the less number of remedial classes conducted for certain subjects, and reminded that remedial classes under EAP was a major component of TEQIP-II. He suggested that all measures, including running extra schedules of the College Bus, and conducting remedial classes outside the college, should be tried to attract students, and that expenditure for the same maybe met from TEQIP-II funds. Remedial classes can be conducted for theory as well as laboratory subjects. He also emphasized the fact that remedial classes are to be conducted for academically weaker students, who should be identified through quizzes, diagnostic tests and assignments, at the beginning of the semester itself. He instructed the Academic Committee to take note of this and comply, and the same maybe reported in the next BOG. Professor Narayanan also remarked that the services of a professional student counselor maybe made available for the students, and the expenditure for the purpose maybe booked under the Equity Action Expenditure.

Sri. M. Sheriff opined that the best faculty maybe identified for remedial classes. Reputed and competent faculty from outside the institute maybe invited, and that individual attention must be given to the students.

Shri M Sheriff asked to explore possibility of conducting such courses at a centrally located and accessible location. He also emphasized that all faculty be sent for training programmes, without affecting the conduction of classes.

The BOG took note of the above points and approved.

## **3.1 Summary of expenditure as on 30-11-2013**

The BOG took note of the expenditure summary as per MFMR, presented by the Principal and commented favourably about the progress of the procurement activities.

## **3.2 Status of NCB Packages**

The BOG took note of the progress in the NCB packages, presented by the Principal, as per the detailed agenda notes.

### **3.3 Status of the Construction projects as on 30-11-2013**

The BOG took note of the progress in the civil construction activities as per the minor civil works plan of the College, presented by the Principal.

### **3.4 Report on the meeting for pilot implementation of Quality Enhancement in Engineering Education at New Delhi**

The details of the QEEE programme were already presented under section 2.2.

### **3.5 Accreditation status of the eligible programs**

The BOG took note of the status of applying for accreditation, and requested the Director of IHRD, to take steps to facilitate the accreditation process, by appointing sufficient number of permanent faculty and to take steps to provide sufficient built up space for the college.

### **3.6 Report on steps taken to improve infrastructure and faculty positions**

The BOG took note of the steps taken to improve infrastructure and faculty positions at College of Engineering Cherthala, in the meeting convened in the Chamber of the Hon. Secretary of Higher Education, Govt. of Kerala, where a presentation for the purpose was made by the DTE and the SPFU Director. Professor Narayanan asked the TEQIP Coordinator to present the salient features of the PowerPoint presentation for the benefit of the BOG. The TEQIP Coordinator presented the status of faculty positions, built up area etc, and other factors that are to be addressed to enable the college to undergo process of accreditation, and also achieve the deliverables of TEQIP-II. The Director of IHRD informed that steps have been initiated to fill up regular faculty vacancies, and that work on the new academic block utilizing the NABARD grant will be started shortly by the PWD.

### **4.1 Other Items – permission to start IRG Accounts for maintaining four corpus funds**

The BOG gave permission to start the accounts for maintaining the corpus funds. Professor Narayanan informed that separate bank accounts are to be started for each of the funds and that the IRG generated by the institute be equally deposited in these four accounts.
